Who We Are

- only independent pre-k through 8th grade Jesuit school in tri-state area
- non-tuition-based – 85% of income from foundations, corporations and individual donors
- 70-year history of serving Harlem
- no child turned away because of inability to pay tuition
- some financial commitment from every family with an enrolled child
- annual tuition is \$3,000 – actual annual cost to educate each student exceeds \$14,000
- accredited by Middle States Association of Colleges and Schools
- member of NativityMiguel Network and National Catholic Education Association

Who We Serve

- 250 inner-city children, ages 3 to 14, at great risk of school failure
- students of all faiths
- all academic abilities, including some with special needs
- 84% live in single-parent homes
- 82% of families cannot afford \$3,000 tuition
- 50% of families earn less than \$36,000
- 70% of families earn less than \$45,000

What We Offer

- positive, safe environment where every child is respected, cherished, challenged and held to high standards
- focus on whole child's growth: academic, social, ethical and physical
- strong core academics
- 2.5 hours of English language instruction daily and oratory for middle school students
- extended school days for middle school students from 8:15 am to 5:15 pm
- dynamic after-school programs for elementary school students until 6:00 pm every day
- extended school year for all middle schoolers: 4 weeks of summer enrichment and sleep-away camp in upstate New York
- support for graduates: high school tuition aid, counseling, college prep, safe haven and more
- library with special collections of picture books, visual arts materials and African American culture and history – largest collection of any Catholic elementary school in New York City

What We Deliver

- every student meets high standards of success
- consistently higher test scores on New York State examinations than area public school students
- on-time graduation of all 8th graders
- 95% of 8th graders admitted to 1st or 2nd choice high schools
- every 8th grader admitted to at least one private high school
- 96% high school graduation rate for students participating in our Graduate Support Program
- nearly every child in our Graduate Support Program enrolls in a four-year college
